1. General Aims of the unit

2. Summarize the vision of St. Paul about sacrificing to the idols and its interpretation now in a simple statement; the Lord's supper and its practices in the early life of the church and our practices now.
3. Compare the characteristics of love as St Paul mentioned in Ch. 13 with that mentioned by St. John in his 1st epistle.
4. List the gifts of the Holy Spirit as St Paul mentioned starting from the most important to the least . State the controls St. Paul established for the gift of tongues in the church.
5. Write an essay about the resurrection of the bodies , its relation to the risen body of Christ , the events of the next coming of Christ
