Here we see that there is no shadow of doubt in the mind of the reader. He remains hopeful and at ease in the midst of the trouble and patiently waits on the Lord to deliver.

He does not at any time ask why me or why this. He asked that your burnt offering may be acceptable before the Lord. Yet if God created us to be filled with joy, created in His likeness as we see in the plan of Paradise, then how can we be joyful in suffering?

You have to focus your eyes on the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. He is the source of joy. The Lord Jesus Himself came and was incarnated to be crucified for the world, and this was His pleasure. In His mission he carried the very sin of the world, lived as a common man and died a fools death.

We usually accept suffering as a means of correction. Although through the Lords guiltless suffering, we see it became sanctified and blessed so that we may enjoy all suffering as though enduring it for the name of our Lord.

Consider Joseph, if he had not suffered
he would not have been exalted,
becoming as we know second to pharaoh
in his day. He went from ashes to glory
through much tribulation.

Consider St Paul in Acts

13:50-52

5:40-41

□ So let us learn from them and “Rejoice

Happiness vs Joy

What is the difference?

So is there a distinction between the two? Yes indeed as they differ in their source and the permanence.

It is important to distinguish between (earthly) happiness and (heavenly) joy.

- Happiness is dependent on happenings and people.
- Joy is the divine dimension of life, enjoyed only in the company of ones Creator. Our inner peace and joy are intertwined and ought not be affected by promotion or emotion, trials, misfortune or circumstance. It is the presence of God Himself that allows us to experience and live in joy. It is apart from the external situation.

St Paul wrote from the ‘apparent’ misery of a cold wet prison:

“Rejoice in the Lord always.
Again I will say, rejoice!”

How is this possible? □

BE JOYFUL NO MATTER WHAT!!

Instead of asking why me or why
is this happening, ask what?

1. Now WHAT?

Now what is God doing? Now what is God's purpose? Now what does God want to show me? Now what does God want to do through this?

"Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel. As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. Because of my chains, most of the brothers in the Lord have been encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly.' Philippians 1:12-14

God can change your bad circumstance or misfortunes into gladness. God can change your unhappiness into joy! Think of Moses reaching the Red Sea and how it proved the power of God to the faithless jews.

2. So WHAT?

“It is true that some preach Christ out of envy and rivalry, but others out of goodwill. The latter do so in love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. The former preach Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely, supposing that they can stir up trouble for me while I am in chains. But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice.” Philippians 1:15-18

So what will this matter and what does this mean
and what can I learn from this.

We need to look beyond the little hiccups and problems and focus
on the long term benefit and possible outcome.

Consider what is really important right now and lets get to the stage
where we can really discern what is worthy of stealing our inner joy!

“Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!”
