1. GENERAL AIMS OF THE UNIT

Better Understanding of the Journey of the Lent to live in its spirituality

2. SPECIAL AIMS OF THE LESSON

- 1. Explain thoroughly the characters of this parable and their symbols now . Briefly explain also , the other 2 parables in Ch.15
- 2. The open embrace of the Father for all the sinners
- 3. The first step to return back to the Father and repent and be accepted again is to "came to yourself"
- 4. Show the joy of the Father when His son returned back, and how he express this joy in practical gifts.
- 5. Explore why the Father didn't allow the son to continue his confession (V.19)
- 6. Highlight the feelings of the elder son and explain the motives behind it.

3.OUTCOMES

By the end of this lesson the teens are able to:

- 1. Highly appreciate the love and care of the Father to accept them back regardless of their sins by a short prayer meeting at the end of the class where everyone give thanks to the Lord Jesus for accepting him/her today. Repeat together this verse " behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me." (Rev.3:20). Practice this daily
- 2. Recite the gifts of the Father and their meanings in their lives.
- 3. Practice confession in a more appropriate way by checking first their actual lives and compare the results of sin against the peace and joy with the Lord and offer a true repentance.
