


REPENTANCE

- John the Baptist, who came before Jesus, preached repentance – Matt. 3:1-2
- Jesus, when He began His work in earnest, preached repentance – Matt. 4:17 (cf. Mark 1:15)
- The apostles, to include Peter and Paul, preached repentance – Mark 6:12; Acts 2:38; 3:19; 20:18-21
- God Himself, who for a time winked at ignorance, now commands repentance – Acts 17:30 – Why?






From Sin
