(3) What will the men give to Saul?

(4) What instruments will the prophets that Saul comes into contact with be carrying?

(5) What will happen to Saul after meeting the prophets that will cause him to become a new man? (Hint verse 6)

(6) How many days will Saul have to wait before Samuel returns?

Tuesday (Read 1 Samuel 10: 9-16)

(7) It came to pass that the Spirit of God descended upon Saul and he began to prophesy among the prophets. What proverb arose from the people's response to Saul's actions? (Hint- verse 12)

(8) When the Spirit of God came upon Saul, we witnessed a dramatic change in his behaviour for the better, what does this teach you about what can happen if the Spirit of God enters into your own life?

(9) When Saul's uncle asked Saul to tell him what Samuel had told him, how did Saul respond?

(10) What information did Saul neglect to tell his uncle?

Wednesday (Read 1 Samuel 10: 17-22)

(11) Who had the Lord previously saved the Israelites from? (Hint- verse 18)

(12) By demanding a King, what were the Israelites really saying to God? (Hint- verse 19)

(13) From which tribe and family does Saul come from?

(14) Where was Saul hiding at the time of his appointment?

Thursday (Read 1 Samuel 10:22-27)

(15) When Saul stood before the people as king, how did he look?

(16) What did the people shout to greet in their new King?

(17) What did Samuel explain to the people?

(18) Where did Saul go after leaving the people?

(19) Why did some people despise Saul?



Friday (Read 1 Samuel 11: 1-10)

(20) How many days did the elders of Jabesh ask Nahash to wait for, before attacking?

(21) What message did Saul ask his messengers to give to the people? (Hint- verse7)

(22) What happened to make all the people consent to Saul's request? (Hint- verse 7)

(23) Following Saul's request for help, how many Israelites were prepared to go to battle?

DID YOU KNOW :

Saul used the oxen as an attention getter, not as sacrifice. He wanted the people to understand that the situation was serious (1 Samuel 11:7)

Saturday (Read 1 Samuel 11:11-15)

(24) During battle, how many groups did Saul separate his people into?

(25) Whilst the Israelites wanted to kill the remaining survivors, how did Saul respond?

(26) Following the victory, Samuel said to the people "Come, let us go to Gilgal and renew the Kingdom there". What things did Saul and the people do in Gilgal

DID YOU KNOW :

Gilgal was the site of many major events in Israel's history. It was the first place the Israelites had stopped after crossing the Jordan River on their way into Canaan. At their campsite in Gilgal, the Israelites had left 12 stones, one for each tribe, as a memorial to the help they had received from God during their long journey. Gilgal had also been Joshua's military headquarters during Israel's battles against the Canaanites. Finally, Gilgal was the place Saul had chosen as the central location for his war against the Philistines. (1 Samuel 11:14)
