Monday (Read 1 Kings 14:1-18)

Omri, who turned out to be a powerful, successful but evil King, set up his capital city in Samaria, 35 miles north of Jerusalem. Of the 12 tribes of Israel, Omri ruled 10. His Kingdom was known as Israel or Samaria. The other 2 tribes were ruled by David's descendants. Their Kingdom was called Judah (1 Kings 16:24)
