**Can You Hear His Voice?**

In chapter 19 verses 11-12 we learn a priceless lesson about prayer. We read that God told Elijah to go up to the mountain and wait for Him. And there was winds, fires, earthquakes - all sorts of noise!! But the Lord did not speak over the top of all this noise, because He has a "still, small voice."

The lesson for us? If we really want to hear the voice of the Lord, and want to feel His presence in our lives, we need **quiet!** So although it is great to pray on the bus or train, we **MUST** have some time alone with God in a quiet environment!

And remember, He won't yell over the TV, iPod, or mobile phone . His voice is still and small - be careful not to drown it out.

What can you do practically? Prepare yourself for prayer. Spend ten minutes in a quiet environment **before** you speak to God (just as Elijah did). So before you pray, take a break from the TV, iPod, mobile etc. And don't just sit there doing nothing! Maybe you can read your Bible (or even do your Bible Study!!)
