The Power of the Cross

What is the cross?

\Rightarrow Defined as

- A structure made by an upright and transverse piece upon which persons were formerly put to death
- ✤ A figure of Christianity
- Adverse or unfavourable



History of the Cross

- Traditionally, the cross was a mark of shame, people considered it to be a curse to be killed on a cross Deuteronomy 21:23
- Therefore, we know it was around long before Jesus
 Incredibly painful and slow way of death
 Became a symbol of VICTORY through Christ
- Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-23

Old testament Symbols

Aarons rod

- Moses' arms lifted up fighting against Analekites
- Bronze serpent
- Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac (carrying wood)
- Jacob blessing sons of Joseph
- Passover lamb/blood on threshold of houses of Israelites
- Rock in the wilderness
