# Moses Life in Egypt and Wilderness Code: 8/OT/1

"Introduction to the books of Exodus, Numbers and Deuteronomy"

## 1. General Aims of the unit

Better Understanding of the Pentateuch (the 5 books of Moses) and the dealings of God with them during their journey to the promised land

## 2. Special aims of the lesson

- 1. To review briefly the life of the Jews in Egypt as slaves for ~400 years(Ex.1:8-22)
- 2. To explore the faith of Moses' family , the effect of the teaching of his mother and God's plan to prepare him to the leadership (Ex. 2:1-10; 23-24; refer also to Heb.11:23-26)
- 3. To explain the reasons behind his failure in his first attempt to defend his people and his escape from Egypt.(Ex. 2:11-15)
- 4. To detail his life in the wilderness for 40 years and why it was essential to prepare him for leadership.(Ex. 2:16-22)
- 5. To explore fully the appearance of the Lord God to Moses in the burning bush and his call to go back to Egypt to save his people from slavery. (Ex. 3)

### **3.Outcomes**

#### By the end of this lesson the teens are able to:

- 1. Recall back the plan of God to save His people
- 2. Compare between Mosses 'Pharaoh's grandson', the leader in the Egyptian Army and Moses after 40 years in the wilderness.
- 3. Compare the shepherd's experience(Moses, David,...) with the qualification needed for the servants of the Lord God.
- 4. Compare between the appearance of the Lord on the bush and the incarnation of Jesus Christ in the fullness of time.
