# The Genealogy of Christ

- The Gospel according to St Matthew
  - 1:1 The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the Son of David, the Son of Abraham: 2 Abraham begot Isaac, Isaac begot Jacob, and Jacob begot Judah and his brothers... 16 And Jacob begot Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus who is called Christ. 17 So all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations, from David until the captivity in Babylon until the Christ are fourteen generations.



#### Why is David mentioned before Abraham? •

- Because David and his kingdom were a prominent thought in the minds of the people.
- Also St Matthew wanted to continue the idea that David's kingdom was eternal. "He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end." (Luke 1:32-33)
- Also David was from Bethlehem

## The Genealogy of Christ

- The Gospel according to St Luke
  - 1:5-25 Annunciation of St John the Baptist
    - 1:26-38 Annunciation of Our Lord Jesus
    - 1:39-56 St Mary visits St Elizabeth
    - 1:57-80 Birth of St John the Baptist
    - 2:1-7 Birth of Our Lord Jesus
    - 2:21 Circumcision of our Lord
      - 2:22-24 Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple
    - 2.41-52 Our Lord in the temple at the age of 12
    - 3:1-22 The preaching of St John the Baptist and the Baptism of Our Lord
      - 3:22 And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him, and a voice came from heaven which said, You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased. 23 Now Jesus Himself began His ministry at about thirty years of age, being (as was supposed) the son of Joseph, the son of Heli ...
    - 38 the son of Enos, the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.

Why does St Luke wait until the Baptism of our Lord at the age of 30 before going through the genealogy?

- Because baptism gives the true heavenly adoption.
- Also he wanted ti wait until the Father calls Him His beloved Son.
- Notice also that St Luke goes back to Adam and then God whilst St Matthew start at Abraham.





## The Wise Men

- Who are the Wise Men?
  - They came from the east, probably from Persia modern day Iran/Iraq
  - They were of high rank, maybe princes, scientists or priests
  - They were experts in Astronomy
  - Perhaps they heard from the Jews in the dispersion about a Saviour who will come to deliver them and to become the king of the Jews? And as a result they did not give Him presents that were suitable for a baby wearing swaddling cloths...
    - Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To the pilgrims of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia (1 Pet 1:1) ... And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matt 2:11)







### Lessons from the Wise Men

- They travelled night and day for weeks to see Him.
- They left their families and country to see Him
- They put themselves in danger to see Him. They came
  to a country that had a King in order to worship another
  King. Despite the danger they travelled a long way to do so.
  - They did not fear danger for they publicly said "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." (Matt 2:2)
  - The Jews who rejected Christ despite having prophets sent from God living amongst them whilst the gentiles followed a star.
    - Let us not take for granted the fact that we were born into Christian families
  - They did not go back to their country the same way they came... "they departed for their own country another way." (Matt 2:12)
    - This symbolises the change in life after meeting Christ. Once we truly meet Him we never go back to our own ways.
