

DID YOU KNOW?

The Babylonian kingdom was distinguished by power and the speed, for the Babylonian kingdom dominated the whole world in a very short period. The kingdom flourished under the reign of King Nebuchadnezzar who was very boastful of his glory against God. His glory was destroyed, when he was expelled from his kingdom. However, he returned to himself and realized that he was a mere man, giving God the glory.

The kingdom of Babylon was captured by the Medes and Persians (Daniel chapter 5-6). The Persians were the cruellest of all the barbarians when it came to punishments. The kingdoms of Medes and Persia did not conquer by military skill nor by swift motion, but through invading the countries by large numbers of army. The Persian Empire gained dominion over the Medes, Assyrians and Babylonians.

In the year 333 BC Alexander the Great, the founder of the Greek Empire, conquered all the Persian powers. Although the Greek empire was less than the Babylonian Empire, Alexander the Great was swifter than the Babylonian emperors, and in four years he ruled all Asia and part of Europe. After the death of Alexander the Great, arose four kings - king of Syria, king of Egypt, Israel and Palestine, the third leader over Macedonia, and the fourth over Thrace.

The Roman Empire was established in the year 63 B.C., and extended until it occupied the kingdoms of Babylon and Persia and Egypt in the year 47 B.C. All the countries of the Mediterranean, including Egypt, submitted to the Roman taxes, and all the Roman laws. Nothing could be more violent and brutal than this empire, it ravished and raided all other countries and took all their possessions for themselves. Under this empire were ten colonies. The Roman Empire never cared about the needs of the colonies but on the contrary, it crushed them. It was this empire that ruled at the time of Jesus.

1. What did he do to the Holy Sanctuary? And the daily sacrifices? (v11-12)

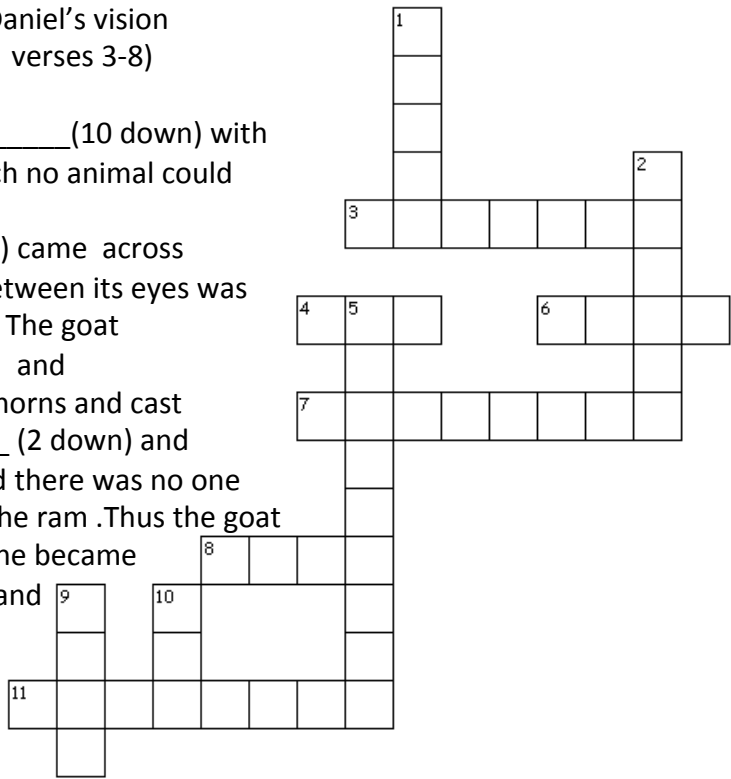
