# **Experiential Learning Activity:** "Moses and the Burning Bush"

For lesson on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November 2011

**Time/context:** 10 minute activity at the end of the lesson for Years 3&4

**Aim**: To guide the children to start thinking about how God might put them in a situation to

speak about Him or be His ambassadors and talking to God about what to do and say.

**Biblical Text:** Exodus 3

### **Materials Required:**

Cut out of a bush and leaves on which to write questions asked by Moses and questions the children brainstorm.

Blu tac, markers

#### **Contemplation for servant**

Exodus 3: 11, 12 But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" So He said, "I will certainly be with you....."

#### **Description of Activity**

The bush is on display with the questions asked by Moses.

The idea is to guide the children through the questions asked by Moses and tease out questions that they would like to ask God.

- 1. Read the questions asked by Moses.
- 2. When may God ask you to speak for Him or do something? (For example stand up for someone, speak about God...)
- 3. Ask open ended questions that will generate a conversation such as : How did you feel? What would you say to God?

When the children think of a question they want to ask God, the servant writes it on a leaf and sticks it on the bush. (or ask the kids to stick it on).
