

The Book of Psalms (Part 7)



Over the past 6 weeks we have explored the Psalms, and realised how we can apply them to our everyday lives. In order to expand our relationship with God, we must learn to speak to Him and ask for His guidance during our lives- whether we're feeling down or quite joyful.

God is there 24/7, so call on Him when:

You are remorseful and penitent for your sins? Read Psalms 51, 32
You are experiencing affliction, and remain comfortless? Read Psalm 22
You are in times of distress, and want encouragement? Read Psalms 27, 31
You are under various mental strains? Read Psalms 41, 70
You are falsely accused? Read Psalm 7
You're in trouble? Read Psalms 54, 63
You are tempted? Read Psalm 130
You are wanting in confidence? Read Psalms 61, 91

Monday (Read Psalm 40 – “I waited patiently for the Lord...”)
