If He who owed nothing to Caesar and who had every right to refuse to pay taxes nevertheless agreed to pay them, who are we to refuse to do so?

God alone is the judge of the heart!

AUGUSTINE: St. Paul says this so that, when something might be done with either good or bad motives, we should leave the judgment to God and not presume to judge the heart of someone else, which we do not see.



3. "For none of us _____ to himself, and no one _____ to himself" (v7)

No believer lives for himself or dies for himself, because "Christ has died for all, so that those who live no longer live for themselves but for him."



5. "let us pursue the things which make for _____ and the things by which one may _____ another" (v19)

Do nothing that would cause another to stumble. Let all that you do be for the neighbor's upbuilding. Always be the PEACEMAKER so that you do not cause anyone to stumble. Christ himself said "blessed are the peacemakers".



4. "for if we live, we live to the _____, and if we die, we ____ to the Lord" (v8)

Here "death" refers to the death which we die when we are buried with Christ in baptism, and "life" is the life we live in Christ, having died to sin and become strangers to this world.
