Character Profile: Ruth

Moab & Israel were neighbours & enemies. They shared a history of conflicts. But famine & hardships sometimes change attitudes & during an extreme food shortage in Israel, Naomi, her husband. & their two sons moved to Moab. There the boys eventually married local girls, one of whom was Ruth. Years later, after Naomi's husband & both boys died, she decided to return to her home in Bethlehem with her grief. Somewhat to her amazement, Ruth insisted on returning with her. They had not only become a family & friends; they had also grown to share a common faith.

The events that led up to Ruth's marriage to Boaz of Bethlehem were full of romance & excitement. God brought goodness out of grief. God grafted a foreign daughter into his own lineage. For we discover at the end of Ruth's story that she was an ancestor of King David. This fact also makes her part of the family tree of Jesus, the Saviour & King!
