## The Book of Judges - An Introduction

So we are starting the book of Judges. What is it all about? Well, if we understand where it fits in with the other books, then it will all make a little more sense. First there was Adam, then Noah's Ark and then the Tower of Babel. Afterwards there was Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, followed by Moses. After Moses, Joshua took charge and then we had the time of the Judges. They were the people who lead Israel after Moses and Joshua (and before the Kings - such as Saul, David and Solomon). ## Tuesday and Wednesday (Read Judges 1: 16-34)

(4) Verses 27 to 34 are confusing. We read about how some of the tribes of Israel did not drive out all the people from the lands they were invading. For example, Ephraim (one of the tribes) did not drive out the Canaanites who dwelt in Gezer (Judges 1: 29). Why is this a big deal? Copy out Judges 2:2 for the answer...

The Judges were leaders of Israel (in between Moses/Joshua and the Kings - Saul, David, Solomon etc.) They included people like Samson, Gideon, Deboarah and others. Samuel was the last judge - which makes sense, since he annointed King Saul. The book has nothing to do with men wearing wigs smashing hammers in court!
