Question 1

Could you could you please tell me a story or a piece of advice that could help kids like me understand what peace means? And how to be peaceful and kind to others?

If you're crossing the road and there's heavy traffic, scary traffic, and then all of a sudden you find mum next to you. More than that, you find mum catching your hand and you go hand in hand. Will you be scared? No, because mum is with you. There's the peace with God. Is He there? Yes? Does He catch my hand? Yes. If He helps me then why should I be scared? I have to have peace, because the King of Peace is with me.

Another example, if I go to the zoo and see a scary lion I am not scared because there is a fence that prevents the lion from touching me. Who is the fence that provides defence for me? God. He is my helper and I am not scared.

Question 2

How did David find peace in his heart to stand up to Goliath when he entered the battle?


Question 3 How does our faith teach us to have peace, especially during difficult times, like exams?

When I answer you, I'll share what Saint Mar Eshak said. He is one of the history teachers. "My conscience said that I will win because I know that I am serving God. I pray to him, I listen to him. I listen to my parents. I never fight with my sister. I always pray..." Then my conscience tells me I'm not going to be let down. So is it possible that I do that for God and He doesn't hear me? Impossible. He's God. If I help His children, wouldn't He help me? He promised.

I'll tell you the story of a king. His name is King Hezekiah. This king one day was told that he would die. He was very sad - not because he's dying, but because he didn't have children. The kings of Judah believed that one of their sons will be Christ. But he didn't have sons! So he thought the Lord is not happy with me. Then he prayed. And he said to the Lord, "Remember how I was good? Lord, remember what I did for You? You've seen my heart, that I'm very true to you. Would you let me down?" Then the Lord said to him, "I heard your voice. I heard your prayers. I saw your tears and I'm going to heal you." So the Lord healed him and gave him 15 years to live. And during these 15 years here, he had a son, and from that son's line came Jesus.
