### 1. General Aims of the unit

Better Understanding of the "Old Testament" and brief study of the people of God after exile

## 2. Special aims of the lesson

- 1. A revision of the 3 waves of the return from exile, and the hero of each wave.
- 2. A brief about the book of Nehemiah, the writer, the suggested date of writing; the main message of the book and the main parts of the book.
- 3. Explore the life of Nehemiah , his zeal to build the city of his father's , his way to solve the destruction of the walls of Jerusalem (Neh.1), how he talked with the king and the support he got from the him (ch.2); how he completed the walls (ch.3); his stand against the enemies (ch.4, 6); how he solved the internal problems of the inhabitants of Jerusalem(ch.5); how he and Ezra educate the people the worship of God .

#### 3.Outcomes

#### By the end of this lesson the teens are able to:

- 1. Deal with Nehemiah as a hero, debate his zeal to build the walls of the city of his fathers, his style in dealing with this problem. His dealing with the enemies and his style of solving the problems of his people. Can we adopt some of his methodology now in our personal life or when there is a problem in the church.
- 2. Reflect on the style of Nehemiah in managing the work of building and completing the walls. Also, his style of building the worship of God among his people.
- 3. Remember by heart the theme of the book of Nehemiah and its main events.
