"In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice." Genesis 22:18




Jacob blesses his sons and prophesied about each of them

- He came to Judah, the fourth son, and blessed him in a strange way, different than the rest. Judah wasn't even his firstborn!

· Who is that person, that would come from Judah's seed that is a law giver and all nations would obey? Who is Shiloh?




Jacob blesses his sons and prophesied about each of them

· Not just that, but the verses prior concerning the same prophecy, Jacob gave a unique description to Judah. A description that was repeated 1600 years later in Revelation!

"Judah is a lion's whelp; From the prey, my son, you have gone up. He bows down, he lies down as a lion; And as a lion, who shall rouse him?" Genesis 49: 9. A lion!!!

"5 But one of the elders said to me, "Do not weep. Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the scroll and to loose its seven seals."

⁶ And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne and of the four living creatures, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as though it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent out into all the earth. ⁷ Then He came and took the scroll out of the right hand of Him who sat on the throne." Revelation 5.



Balaam



I behold Him, but not near;
A Star shall come out of Jacob;
A Scepter shall rise out of Israel," Numbers 24:15-17

· Who is the Star? Sounds a bit like wise men business!



Isaiah the prophet

• There is non of the Old Testament prophets gave explicit details of Jesus' birth, life and passion like Isaiah to the degree that Bible scholars call it the "Fifth Gospel".

"14 Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel. 15 Curds and honey He shall eat, that He may know to refuse the evil and choose the good." Isaiah 7

"For unto us a Child is born,
Unto us a Son is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.

Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

7 Of the increase of His government and peace
There will be no end,
Upon the throne of David and over His kingdom,

The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this." Isaiah 9




Micha The prophet

• This is a very famous prophecy about the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. It was the one that directed Herod to where the born king is and eventually killed all the children there of 2 years of age and younger. However, reading the full text of the prophecy gives amazing details of the coming of Christ!

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah,
Though you are little among the thousands of Judah,
Yet out of you shall come forth to Me
The One to be Ruler in Israel,
Whose goings forth are from of old,
From everlasting."

Therefore He shall give them up,

³Therefore He shall give them up, Until the time *that* she who is in labor has given birth; Then the remnant of His brethren Shall return to the children of Israel. ⁴And He shall stand and feed *His flock* In the strength of the LORD, In the majesty of the name of the LORD His God; And they shall abide, For now He shall be great To the ends of the earth; ⁵And this *One* shall be peace." Micha 5



The massacre of Bethlehem foretold by Jeremiah the prophet some 500 years prior!

"Thus says the LORD:

"A voice was heard in Ramah, Lamentation and bitter weeping, Rachel weeping for her children, Refusing to be comforted for her children, Because they are no more." Jeremiah 31:15

• But the verse after is full of comfort, talks about the salvation, the return of these dead children spirits from Hades to paradise, their return from the land of their enemy, the devil.

"Thus says the LORD:
"Refrain your voice from weeping,
And your eyes from tears;
For your work shall be rewarded, says the LORD,
And they shall come back from the land of the enemy.

17 There is hope in your future, says the LORD,
That your children shall come back to their own border."
Jeremiah 31:16-17
